How the program works

Scholarships are available to women working in specific sectors and specialties. Our scholarship program runs throughout the year. It is important to review each scholarship's eligibility criteria to make an informed decision regarding which scholarship(s) are the most suitable.

Applicants are invited to find a course that they can commit to completing within 18 months of being awarded the scholarship and can meet enrolment requirements of their nominated course. They must be able to articulate why they have chosen their course and how it will benefit them in their current and future role as a woman leader.

CEW also offers several scholarships to specific courses up to certain specified values which can be found within the scholarship criteria.
